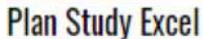

What are Multiple Intelligences?

Multiple intelligence is a theory describing the different ways people learn and acquire information.

This theory was first proposed by Howard Gardner in 1983.

It also states that people are not born with all of the intelligences they will ever have.

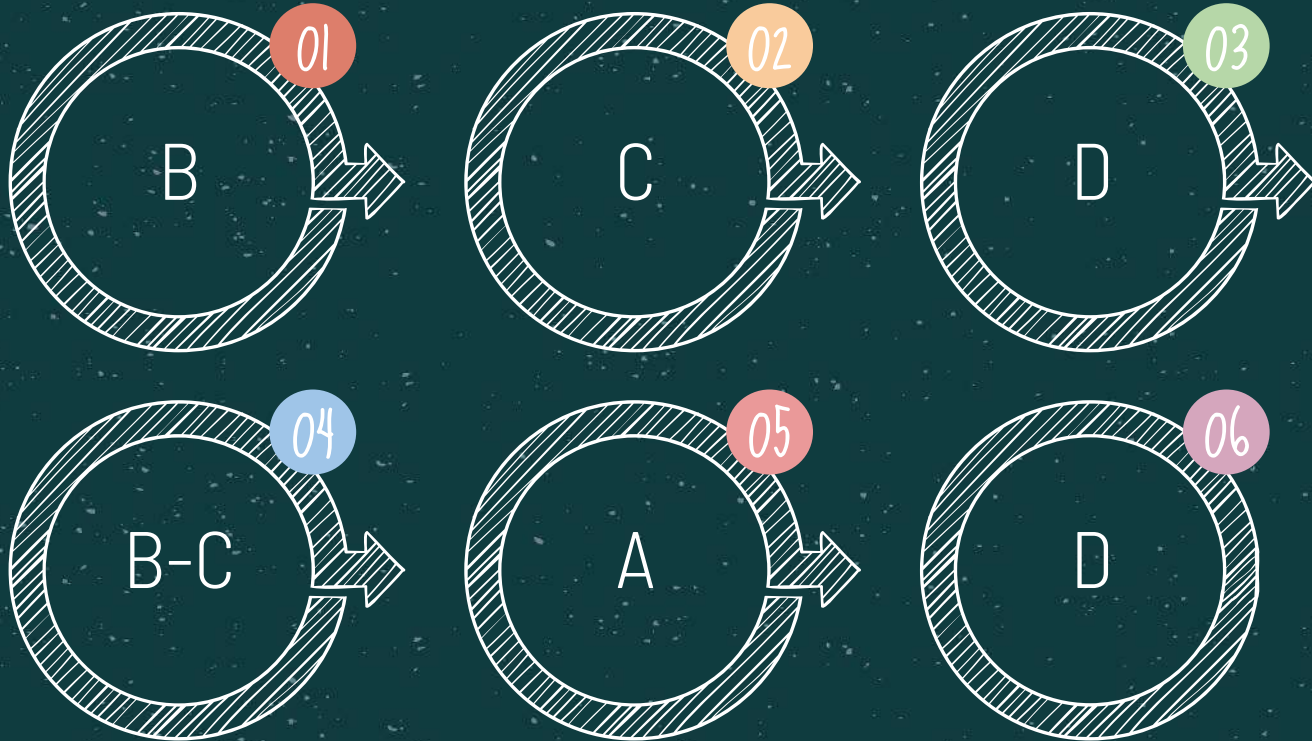

- Why should we value our youth? Explain your answer.



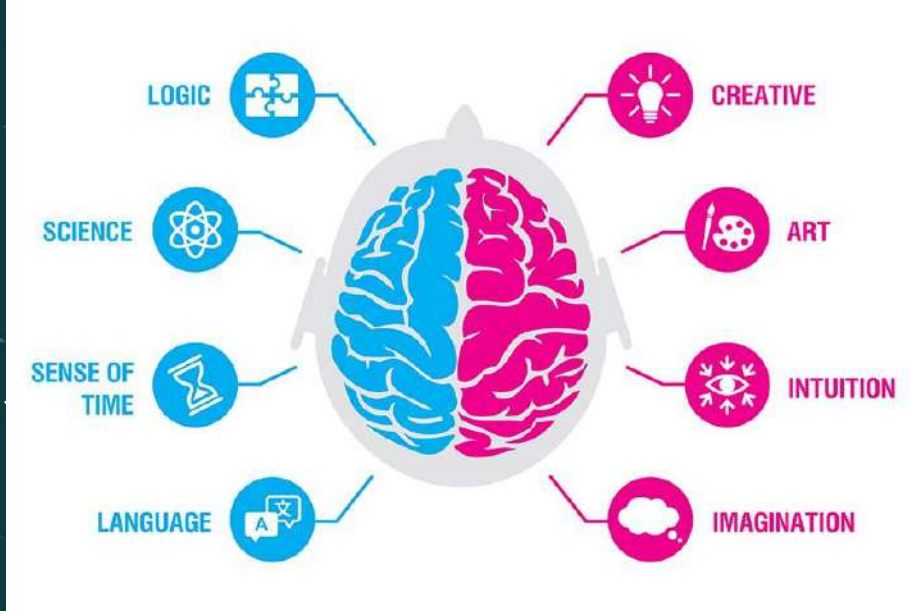
LEFT BRAIN RIGHT BRAIN

Left Brain vs. Right Brain



The human brain can be divided into two twin halves. Certain mental processes and behaviors are mainly controlled by one hemisphere more so than the other. ☆

The left controls the right hand side of the body and receives information from the right visual field controlling speech, language and recognition of words, letters and numbers.

The right controls the left hand side of the body and receives information from the left visual field controlling creativity, context and recognition of faces, places and objects.

Much research has been done to test theories about certain skills being more dominant in the left or right side of the brain. ☆

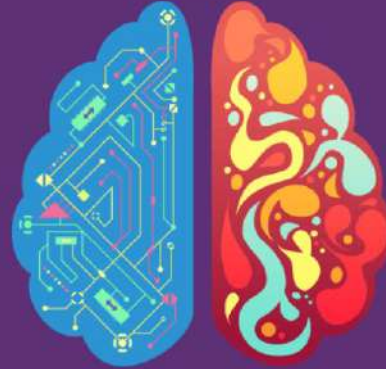
