IESA SPEECH



IESA (Illinois Elementary Association): Middle School

- Solo Acting
 - 5-10 minutes
 - Props: Single chair
- Duet Acting
 - 5-10 minutes
 - 2 actors
 - Props: Chair, stool, or table (2 items total)
- Improv Duet
 - 3 prompts (humorous, dramatic, humorous)
 - 2 minutes each prompt
 - Props: Chair, stool, or table (2 items total)
- Small Group
 - 5-10 minutes
 - 3-5 actors
 - Props: 1 table, 5 chairs

IHSA STATE SERIES

IHSA is the governing body in charge of high school sports and activities in Illinois. Aside from all the usual high school sports, you can also choose to compete with your school's speech team. Some middle schools also have speech teams, governed by the IESA.



IHSA SPEECH CATEGORIES

Dramatic Duet Acting (DDA)/Humorous Duet Acting (HDA)

- Presentation of a dramatic or humorous script by two people

Dramatic Interpretation (DI)/Humorous Interpretation (HI)

- Presentation of dramatic or humorous literature by one person

Extemporaneous Speaking (EXTEMP)

- Presentation of a speech on a selected topic of international or domestic issues
- Given 30 minutes to prepare an original 7 minute speech.

Impromptu Speaking (IMPT)

- Presentation of a speech regarding abstract ideas concerning an assigned topic
- Given 2 minutes to prepare an original 6 minute speech

Informative Speaking (INFO)

- Presentation of an original expository speech



IHSA SPEECH CATEGORIES

Original Comedy (OC)

- Presentation of an original comedic work

Oratorical Declamation (DEC)

- Presentation of persuasive or inspirational material of literary merit

Original Oratory (OO)

- Presentation of an original persuasive speech

Poetry Reading (PT)

- Oral interpretation of poetry
- Allowed to hold the poetry book

Prose Reading (PR)

- Oral interpretation of prose literature
- Allowed to hold the prose book



IHSA SPEECH CATEGORIES

Radio Speaking (RADIO)

- Presentation of a newscast compiling provided stories and a commercial
- Given 45 minutes to select, cut, and prepare 5 minute broadcast

Special Occasion Speaking (SOS)

- Presentation of original speech in a realistic situation for the purpose of entertaining an audience

Performance in the Round (PIR)

- Presentation involving 3 or more students in a space where the fourth wall is removed thus bringing the actor into the same space as the audience
